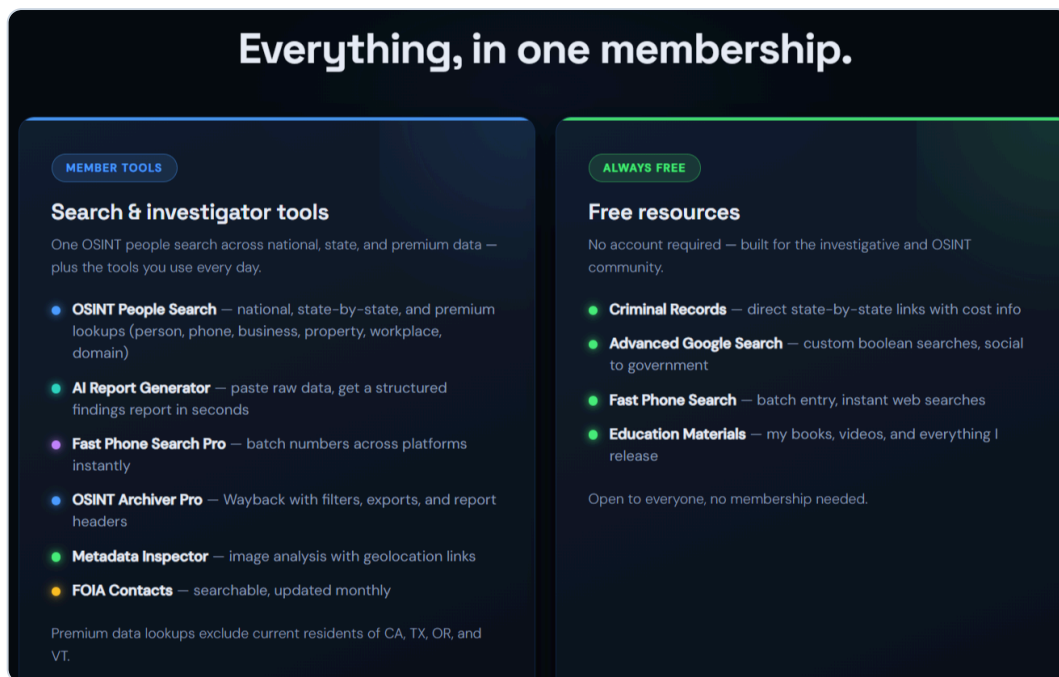

What Skiplook is

Skiplook is a set of investigative tools built for skip tracers, collectors, process servers, and investigators — people who need to find someone, confirm who they are, and back it up with records.

The site is split in two. Some of it is open to anyone with no account at all. The rest comes with a membership.



The two halves of the site: member tools on the left, free resources on the right.

What's free to everyone

Three tools, no account and no payment. Statewide criminal record links, a Google search builder, and a fast phone search. Share them with anyone.

What comes with a membership

Seven tools, led by the people search — free public-record searching nationwide and in all fifty states, plus premium lookups using paid data. Alongside it: an AI report writer, a phone search, a web archive tool, a metadata reader, a username search, and a FOIA contact directory.

You do not need to read this front to back

Find the tool you want, read its few steps, and go.

Free Resources

No account. No payment. Open to anyone — including people you want to send to the site.

FREE RESOURCE

Criminal Records

Direct links to every state that allows a public statewide criminal record search, with the fee each one charges. Thirty-seven states are covered.

These are official state portals — state police, courts, and bureaus of investigation. Skiplook is not running the search; it is pointing you at the right place and telling you what it costs before you get there.

How to use it

- 1 **Find your state** in the table.
- 2 **Check the fee.** It ranges from \$3 in Texas to \$95 in New York.
- 3 **Click the link** and run the search on the state's own site.

Verify the fee before you pay

States change their fees and move their portals without warning. The amount listed is what it was when the page was last checked, not a guarantee.

If your state is not listed

Only states with statewide public access appear here. For the rest, you are looking at a FOIA request or a county-by-county search. The FOIA Contacts tool in the member section gives you the addresses to send those requests to.

Anyone can run these

Statewide public access means exactly that — no licence, no permissible purpose, no account.

FREE RESOURCE

Advanced Google Search

A builder for the kind of Google searches that actually surface people — the operators most searchers never learn. You fill in what you know, and it writes the search string for you.

Advanced Google Search Generator

Automate complex Google Dorks to surface records that are buried or hidden from standard search results. Built for investigators, skip tracers, and researchers.

How it works: Fill in your target details below, then click any search button to fire a precision query directly in Google.

- 1 **Enter what you have** — a name, a username, a phone, an employer.

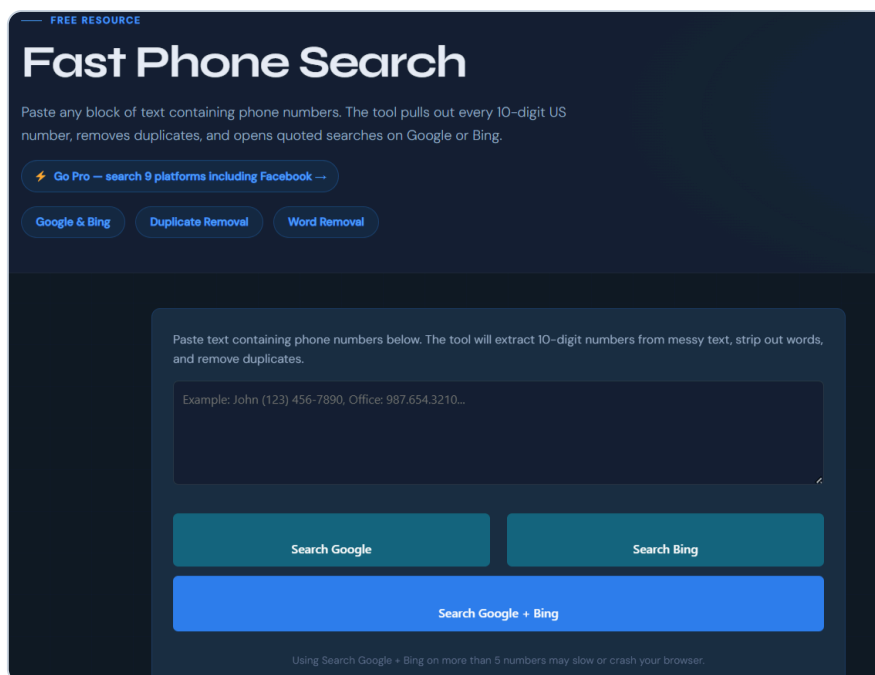
- 2 **Pick a category** that matches what you are trying to find.
- 3 **Click a bundle** to fire the searches, or copy the built string into Google yourself.

FREE RESOURCE

Fast Phone Search

Paste any block of text containing phone numbers. The tool pulls out every US ten-digit number, strips duplicates, and searches them.

Useful when you have a vendor report or a page of notes and you want every number in it checked without copying them out one at a time.

How to use it

- 1 **Paste your text** into the box. It does not need to be tidy.
- 2 **Let it extract the numbers** — duplicates are removed automatically.
- 3 **Search Google, Bing, or both.** Each number opens as its own quoted search.

Members get more

The Pro version in the member section searches nine platforms instead of two, and lets you control the number format. See page — Fast Phone Search Pro.

How credits work

Credits are spent only on premium searches. Every other tool on the site is unlimited, including the free national and state searching inside the people search.

You are only charged for hits

A premium search that finds nothing costs nothing. Search freely.

How credits refill

Credits run on a rolling thirty-day window rather than resetting on the first of the month. Each credit you spend becomes available again thirty days later, so your balance climbs back steadily instead of all at once.

Your remaining balance is shown at the top of the search page and updates as soon as a search is charged.

The two halves

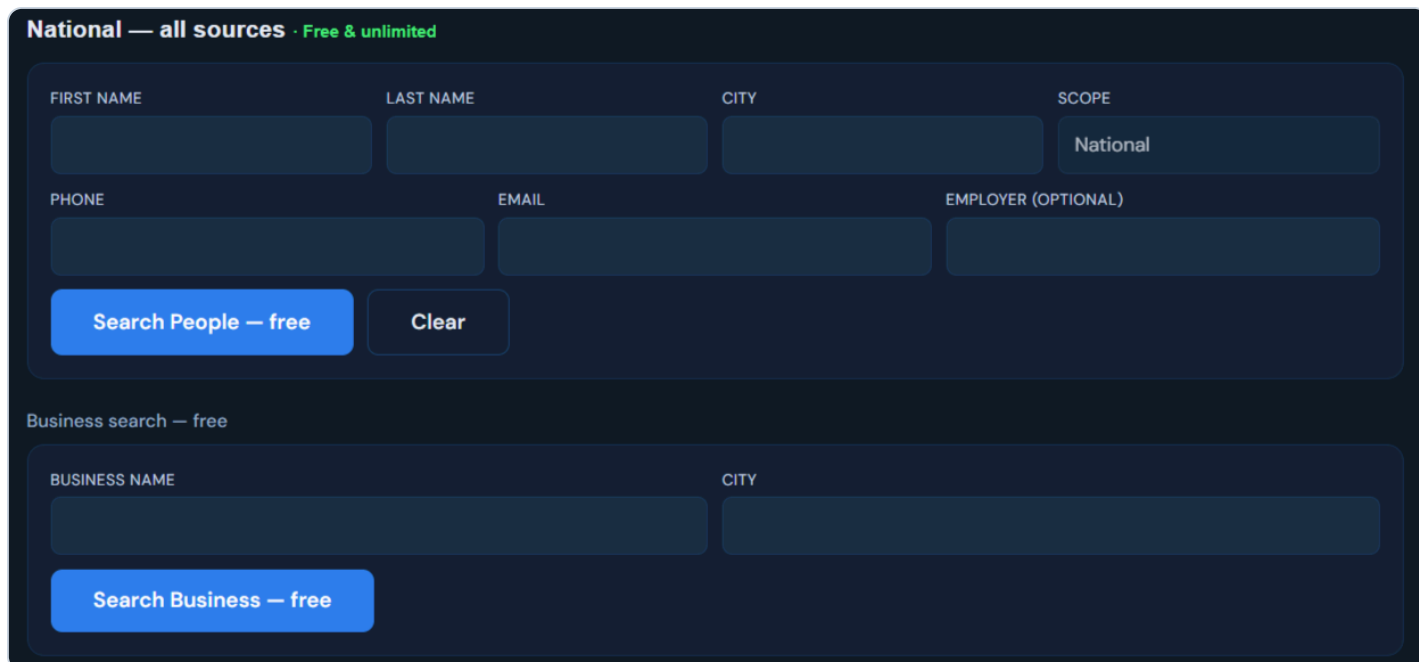
Start free, then go premium

Run the free national search first. It costs nothing and usually tells you which state your subject is in — which makes the premium search you run afterwards far more accurate.

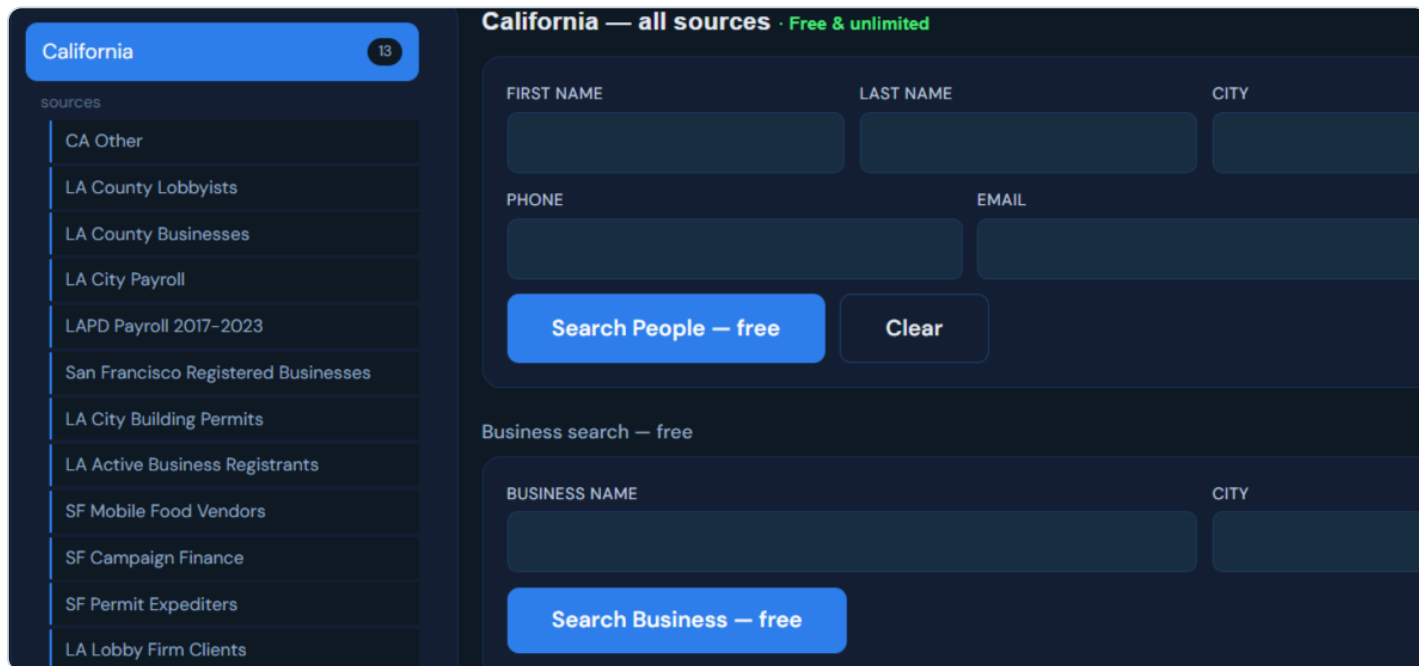

Searching a single state

Each state has its own page with its own sources, and the panel shows you exactly which sources it will search. California, for example, covers thirteen — county lobbyist registers, city payroll, business registrations, building permits, and campaign finance among them.

Every state lists its own named sources so you know what is being searched.

How to use it

- 1 **Start with National** and a first and last name.

- 2 **Read which sources hit.** Results are grouped by record type.
- 3 **Follow the state.** Once a result points at one, open that state and run the same name again — it searches deeper.
- 4 **Repeat as much as you like.** Nothing here is metered.

No state exclusions

The four excluded states that apply to premium searches do not apply here. Free searching covers all fifty states and DC.

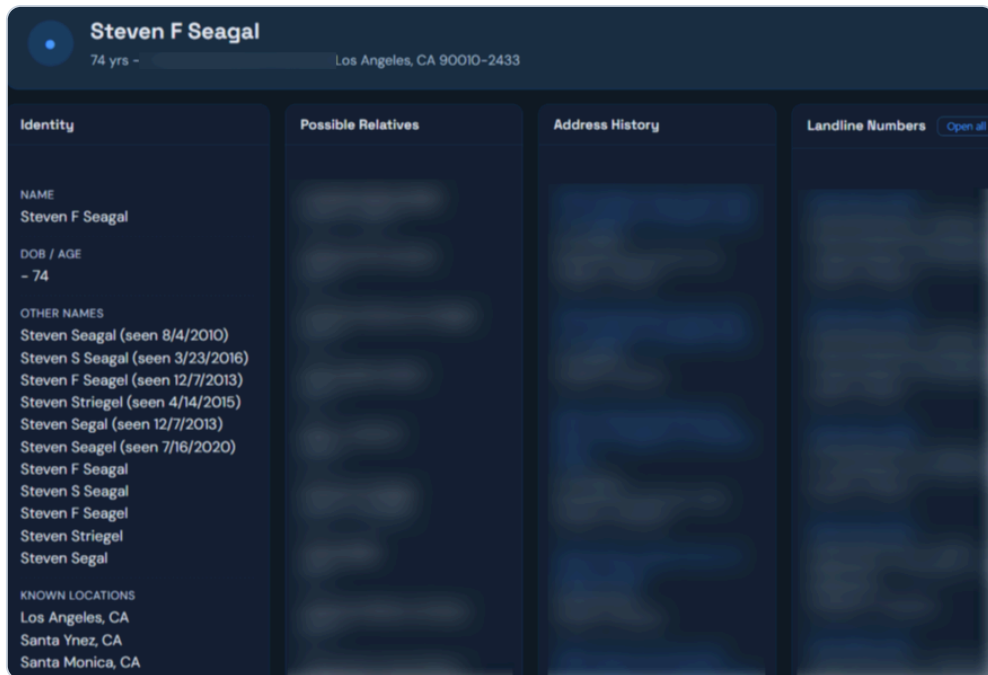
The six premium searches

These use paid data and spend credits. Each form tells you its cost before you run it.

Person search

The one most people start with. Enter a name and whatever else you have. Results come back as columns — identity, possible relatives, address history, and phone numbers.



A person result. Alternate name spellings carry the date each was seen.

- 1 **Enter a name** and any locating detail you have.
- 2 **Pick the right match** if several people come back.
- 3 **Read across the columns** — each one opens to show everything found.

More detail in, fewer wasted searches

A middle initial, an age, or a former address will often turn twelve possible matches into one. Adding them costs nothing.

Reverse Phone

Enter a number, get the person or people attached to it. Click a result to expand it into a full profile.

Premium profiles carry a Copy Profile button and a Print / Save PDF button, so a result can go straight into your file or to a client.

Excluded states

Four states are excluded from premium searches that return information about people. This is a deliberate policy, not an error and not a gap in the data.

What you will see

The search comes back empty, exactly like any search that finds nothing. Because you are only charged on a hit, **an excluded result costs no credits.**

An empty result is not proof of anything

Nothing back on a California subject does not mean no record exists. It means premium data for current residents of that state is not returned.

Historical addresses are fine

The exclusion is about where someone lives now. A subject who lived in Texas five years ago and lives in Ohio today returns normally, with the Texas address in their history.

Your workaround

Free national and state searching has no exclusions and covers all fifty states. For a subject in those four, start there — it costs nothing.

MEMBER TOOL

Investigative Data Fusion

Not a search. This is what you use once the searching is done.

You paste in everything you have gathered — vendor reports, credit reports, social media, court records, your own notes — and it merges all of it into one written findings report.

MEMBER TOOL — AI POWERED

Investigative Data Fusion

Paste raw data from multiple sources. The tool extracts, cross-references, and scores every data point — giving you a structured findings summary ready for your report.

Only put verified things here

This box overrides everything else in the report. Use it for what you personally confirmed — nothing else.

Adding your sources

Each source gets its own box, up to eight per run.

Add a source, label it, date it, paste it. Then Process Sources.

Labelling matters

The label is how the report decides how much to trust what you pasted. Say what kind of source it is, not just where it came from.

Use the kind of source, not the brand name:

Data vendor report

Credit report

Social media

Surveillance

Investigator notes

Court filing

The date field

Fill it in and the report knows which of two disagreeing sources is newer. Leave it blank and that source is treated as unknown age — it will not be called recent and will not be used to order the timeline.

Steps

- 1 Enter the subject's name.
- 2 Add confirmed facts if you have any.
- 3 Paste each source into its own box and label it.
- 4 Process sources and wait.

- 5 **Edit before you keep it.** Use Edit Report to fix a line; copy and print pick up your changes.

What it will not claim

The report never calls something current or confirmed on vendor data alone. A credit-report employer reads as *listed*, because those dates are estimates. Only your confirmed facts make something verified.

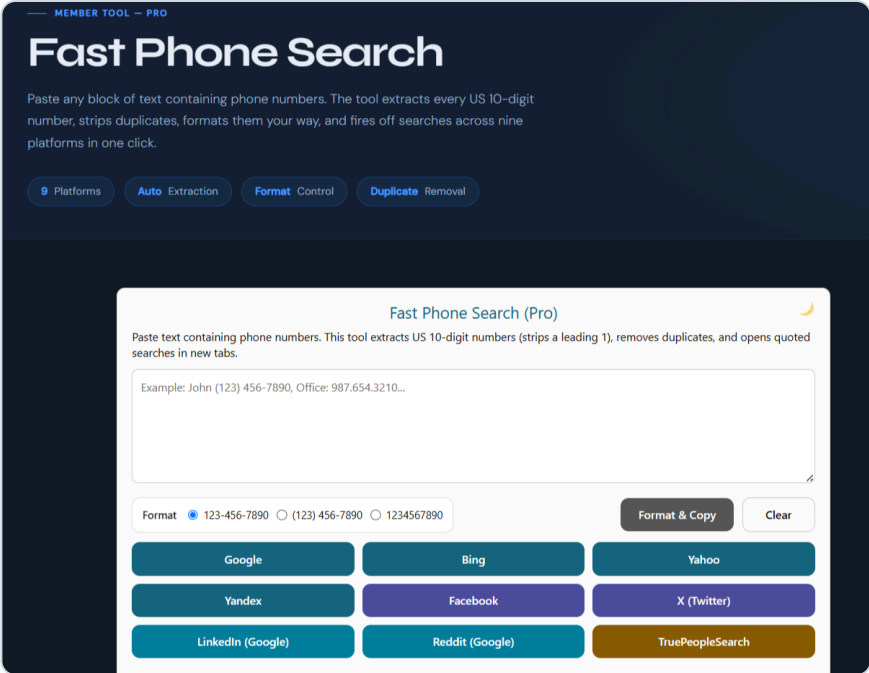
Daily limits

Basic gets one report a day, Premium gets three. Resets at midnight. A failed run does not count.

Fast Phone Search Pro

The member version of the free phone tool. Paste any block of text, and it extracts every US ten-digit number, strips a leading 1, removes duplicates, and fires searches across nine platforms at once.

How to use it

- 1 **Paste your text.** A vendor report, notes, an email — anything.
- 2 **Pick your format** — dashes, brackets, or plain digits.
- 3 **Click a platform**, or use Format & Copy to take the cleaned list elsewhere.

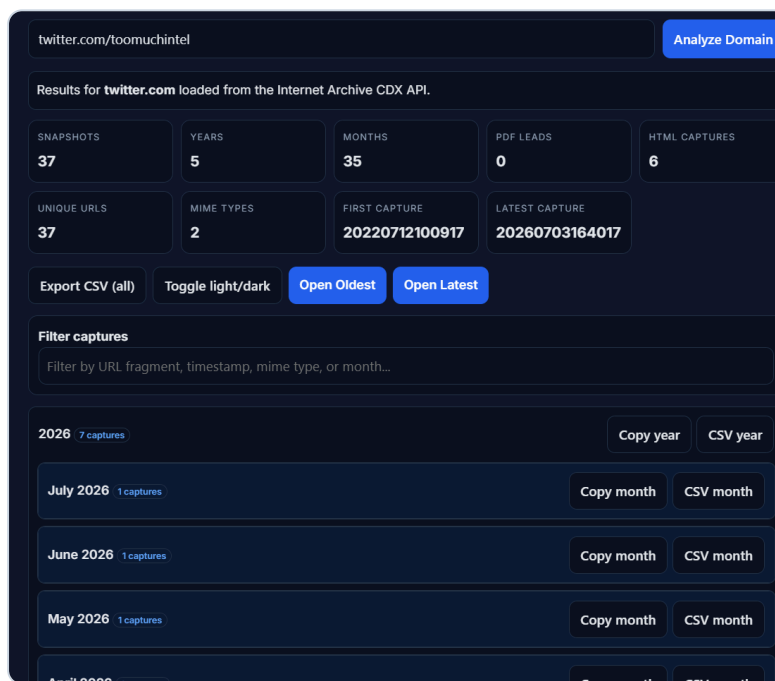
Allow pop-ups

The tool opens a tab per search. If nothing happens, your browser is blocking them — allow pop-ups for skiplook.com.

MEMBER TOOL

OSINT Archiver Pro

A front end for the Internet Archive. Enter a domain or a profile URL and it pulls every capture the archive holds, then lets you filter and export them.



Capture counts across the top, then everything grouped by year and month.

What you get

Total snapshots, how many years and months are covered, PDF and HTML capture counts, unique URLs, and the first and latest capture dates. Below that, every capture grouped by year and month.

How to use it

- 1 Enter a domain or profile URL and analyse it.
- 2 Read the summary to see how much history exists.
- 3 Filter by URL fragment, timestamp, or file type to narrow it.
- 4 Open oldest or latest, or export to CSV — all of it, one year, or one month.

Why it matters

A profile or business page that has been edited or taken down often still exists in the archive. This is how you find what a page used to say.

Metadata Inspector

Reads the hidden data inside images, PDFs, and Word documents — GPS coordinates, camera make and model, software fingerprints, author history, timestamps, and embedded thumbnails.

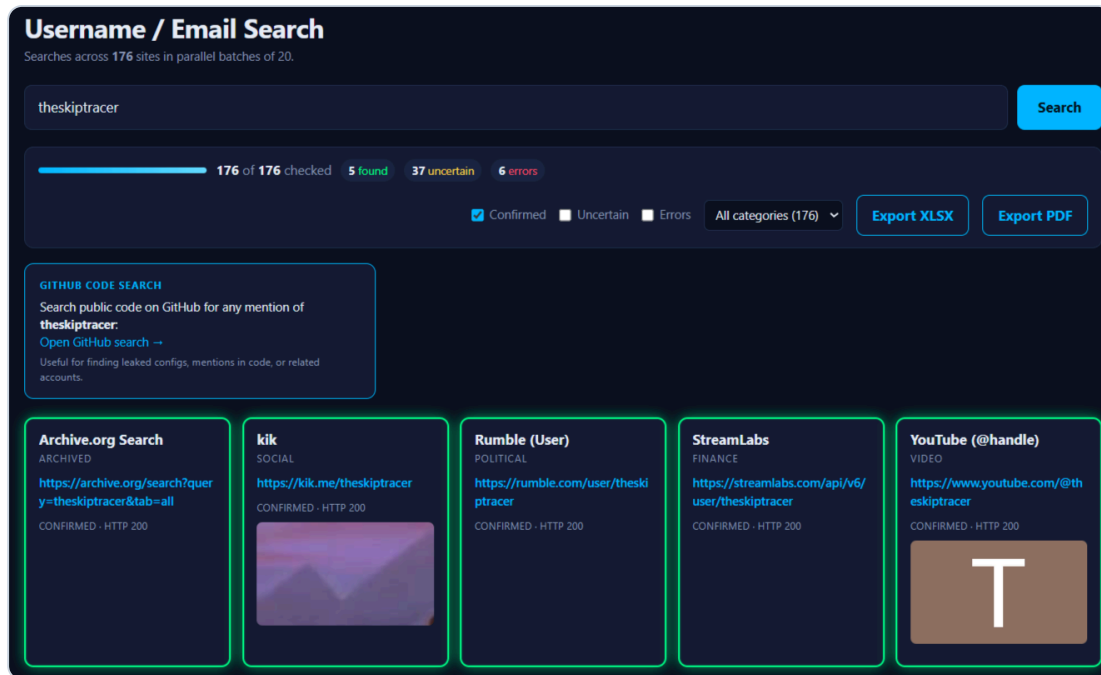
How to use it

- 1 Choose a file or drag it in.
- 2 Optionally add a second to compare.
- 3 Review the fields — check for GPS coordinates and camera model in particular.
- 4 Export CSV or PDF to keep it for your file.

Username / Email Search

Enter a username or an email address and it checks 176 sites for an account, running twenty at a time.



Results sorted into confirmed, uncertain, and errors, with a card for each hit.

Reading the results

Every result lands in one of three buckets. **Confirmed** means the site returned a real profile. **Uncertain** means the response was ambiguous and needs a human look. **Errors** means the site could not be reached — not that nothing is there.

Each confirmed hit shows the platform, its category, the direct URL, and a thumbnail where one exists.

How to use it

- 1 Enter a username or email.
- 2 Wait for the run to finish — the counter shows progress.
- 3 Check the uncertain ones yourself. Real accounts hide in there.
- 4 Export to XLSX or PDF for your file.

There is a GitHub code search link too — useful for finding a username mentioned in leaked configs or public repositories.

Each credit returns thirty days after the day you spent it, rather than everything resetting on a fixed date.

Do the free searches use credits?

Never. National and state searching is unlimited on both plans, and so is every tool outside the six premium searches.

My Data Fusion report looks cut off.

Long reports have a length limit. If one is reached you will see an amber warning above the report. Split your sources across two runs.

Can I fix a mistake in a report?

Yes. Edit Report, make your changes, then Done Editing. Copy and Print pick up your edits.

Nothing happens when I click a phone platform.

Your browser is blocking pop-ups. Allow them for skiplook.com.

Which plan am I on?

Your credit balance says so: Basic is 40 a month, Premium is 100. It is at the top of the search page.
